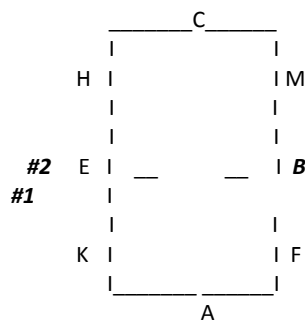




SEDA's "PRIX CAPRILLI" INTRODUCTORY LEVEL - TEST #1

This test is for horses with jumping experience showing Introductory level dressage or above; horses must jump a maximum height of 18" crossrails. It is understood that in the working gaits, a jumping horse isn't expected to be as round as a competing dressage horse, but the horse must softly accept the bit & may show more "roundness" in the parts of the tests separate from the jumps. Posting trot expected, & halt may be done through the walk. Test may be called. Refusals will be penalized as an error. Knockdowns are penalized at judge's discretion. (In case of a rail down, judge will ring the bell for the rider to stop without penalty. After rail is replaced, the bell will be rung again telling the rider to continue from where she stopped.)



1. A Enter working trot rising.
2. C Track right.
3. B Circle right 20 meters, incorporating **Jump #1** into circle. Continue straight on quarter line to end.
4. A Medium walk.
5. KXM Free walk.
 M Medium walk.
6. C Working trot rising.
7. E Circle left 20 meters, incorporating **Jump #1** into circle.
 E Straight ahead.
8. A Down centerline.
 X Halt through medium walk. Salute. Leave arena on a loose rein.

General Impressions:

Gaits	(rhythm, clarity, jumping style)	(x1)
Suppleness/balance	(longitudinal/lateral, ability to shorten/lengthen)	(x2)
Relaxation/obedience	(tempo, confidence, harmony, acceptance of bit)	(x2)
Rider score	(position & seat of rider, timing to jumps)	(x3)
