All riders will be required to wear helmets and an up-to-date medical armband or bracelet both days and safety vest on XC course Sunday. \$20 Auditing Fee. Cancellation spots must be filled to receive a full refund. Snacks and water will be available both days to riders & a dinner with Doug will be planned for Saturday night. Participants are encouraged to bring additional snacks & refreshments. For a list of nearby accommodations, please reference the USEA Omnibus listing for the Fleur de Leap Horse Trials. If you wish to stay on site and need an electric hook-up (\$40/night), arrangements should be made with the Morgan Vaughn. Bathroom and shower access on site. Bagged shavings (\$9) must be pre-ordered.

RELEASE AND WAIVER

Every entry at an equine activity shall constitute an agreement and affirmation by trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, handler, their principals, representatives, employees and agents, that they 1) will obey all local rules of the activity; 2) represent that every horse, rider, driver and handler is eligible as entered; 3) agree to be bound by the rules of inherent risk of serious injury or death (see below) and, by participating in the activity, accept as final the decision of the Activity Management on any question arising under said rules and agree to hold the activity, its officials, directors and employees, and Morgan Draper Vaughn harmless for any action taken; 4) agree that as a condition of entry, they authorize the activity management to market, transfer, assign or otherwise make use of any photographs, likenesses, films, broadcasts, cablecasts, and audiotape taken of the horse(s) and participant(s) while on the grounds, incident to or in transit between stabling facility and event site, in any way they see fit for promotion or any coverage for the benefit of the event, without compensation to any of them, so long as the use neither jeopardizes amateur status nor endorses a specific product or service, and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such coverage, including any claim to invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation; and, 5) agree that they participate voluntarily in the activity fully aware that horse sports carry inherent risks of injury or death and that by participating they expressly assume any and all risk of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold the activity and its officials, directors, employees, and agents harmless against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered in connection with the activity, whether or not such claim, injury or loss resulted directly or indirectly from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees and agents.

WARNING Under LOUISIANA law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to R.S. 9:2795.3
